SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME INFORMATION

Short overview of the programme

The scientific programme commences on Thursday 27 June with the first session of oral presentations of poster abstracts. This will be followed by the first of six abstract sessions.

There are four didactic sessions on Venous Thromboembolism, AI; Post-thrombotic Syndrome; New Devices, Varicose Veins and Technology and Varicose Veins, Imaging, Stenting. The Prize winning papers from the American Vein and Lymphatic Society and the Japanese Society of Phlebology will take place on Friday 28 June at 13.30. Thirty abstracts of high scientific quality will be presented over 6 sessions. These were selected from over 100 abstracts submitted. In addition to the oral presentations, there are 41 ePoster presentations. These are viewable on the Conference App. The top nine abstracts will be presented at the Oral Poster sessions at 08.00 each morning.

This year, there are two joint sessions, one with the American Venous Forum and European Society of Vascular Surgery (Friday at 16.00) and the second with the Balkan Venous Forum (Saturday at 11.00).

We are pleased to welcome Professor Alex Spyropoulos (New York, USA) as the EVF Invited Lecturer 2024. His presentation "Peri-operative management of patients with vitamin K antagonists and direct oral anticoagulants: Present and future perspectives" will be given on Friday 28 June at 12.00.

Information for presenters

All presenters must bring their presentations on a USB memory stick to the Slide Preview Desk, situated at the AV desk in the lecture hall at least 2 hours prior to presentation (or the previous evening for morning presentations).

Floor microphones are available in the Lecture Theatre. Delegates wishing to join in the discussion should stand by the nearest microphone and wait to be acknowledged by the Chair.

The official language of the symposium is English. All presentations, questions and discussion will be held in English.

The three abstracts of the winners are sent to the American College of Phlebology who will select one and award a grant to present at the AVLS meeting in November 2024 and the Japanese Society of Phlebology who will select one and award a grant for presentation at the meeting in 2025.

The Prizes are awarded during the congress dinner on Friday evening (28 June 2024).


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
